Behind the scenes...Women's Fellowship

The work of the Women's Fellowship is split into two areas;

- The Thursday afternoon traditional meeting, consisting of hymns, Bible reading and a speaker.
- The Monthly Fellowship lunches which have an invited after dinner speaker to present a Christian message.

The Afternoon meetings.

These are held on the second Thursday, once a month. Numbers are around 15, with several of the ladies coming in from the village. Tea & biscuits are served after the meeting and as many of the ladies are retired and living on their own, this social time is a valued part of the afternoon. The ladies all enjoy being involved and often bring along an item that they can speak about by way of personal testimony.

The Fellowship lunches.

A real encouragement to the ladies that organise this valuable work. Regularly these meals are attended by between 45/50 folk, both ladies and men, and are a very gentle way of introducing the Christian message to folk who would not normally come along to BRBC. Attendees are mainly the over 60 age group. Friends are often made over the meal and return regularly. The food is of a high quality and it's not unusual for the men to ask for more! The invited speakers are well received and are able to share their faith or a Christian thought in a non threatening way after the meal has finished.

If you have not attended before, look out for details in the News Sheet, the meals and afternoon meetings start again in September.

Can we encourage you to pray for the small group of ladies that are responsible for these events, and ask that the Lord will bless the work for His sake.
