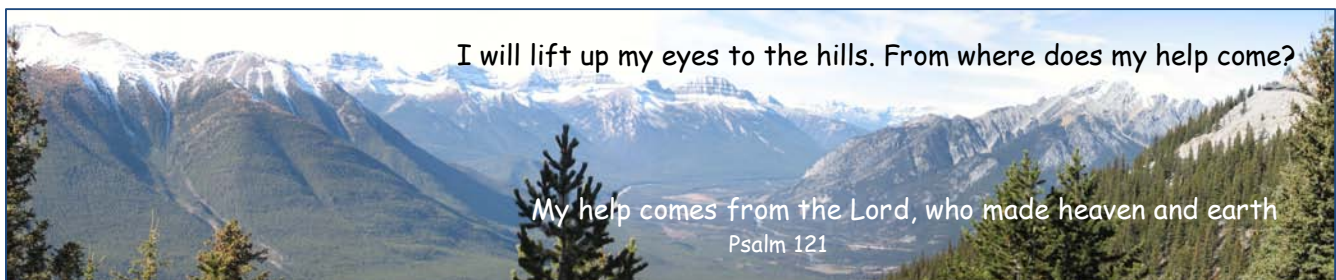

Alistair McGrath in a book entitled 'Heresy' says this about our age:

Heresy is about being master of our own universe, choosing the way things are-or at least the way we would like them to be. Yet perhaps the ultimate appeal of heresy in our times lies in its challenge to authority.'

But what happens when Jesus steps into the midst of a structure constructed by man? Obviously the question that would need to be answered is who has the supreme authority, Christ or man? In your life who really gets the final say? You? Christ? Someone else?

This one is for a married couple. Could it be YOU?

We received an e-mail this week explaining the urgent need for a married couple to act as “hostel parents” in the Cameroon. The hostel, run by an association of missions, is the home for children from several families involved in various Christian projects in the CAR and beyond, as they are taught at the Rain Forest International School. The hostel parents need to be in post ready for the new school year that starts THIS August and without the parents in place the hostel will not function and the children will not be able to continue their school education!!

Being a parent is a demanding job, but it brings a lot of rewards. Here’s what Janelle Johnson wrote about her time as a hostel assistant.

“As I was getting ready to spend the evening with 12 teenagers whose collective life experience spans 3 continents, 6 languages, and more years spent in foreign cultures than in their own passport countries. I knew God was at work in that place...My time in Cameroon was an opportunity to be part of Gods work in that country. I was able to come along side career missionaries and encourage them in their work as well as support the work of Bible translation, church planting, medical services and the agricultural development work of missionaries from numerous mission organisations”

What kind of people are needed? Often an “older couple”, who;

- Are mature Believers
- Are in a healthy marriage
- Have serving hearts
- Love teenagers
