## UPDATE ON THE “WEST SPECIAL SCHOOL” PROJECT IN KENYA

You may remember that James Martin recently brought to us the desperate needs of the WEST School in Kenya that cares for, and teaches, neglected and abandoned children. All the children have mental or physical difficulties.

A meeting was held recently to bring together people from the fellowship who have a cross-section of skills that could be needed to support this project and make it happen i.e.; finance, mission, building & planning, administration, spiritual etc. James Martin explained the need again and presented the school's written “Vision Plan”.

The meeting was honest and candid, discussing and acknowledging the considerable size, risks and amount of commitment that would be needed to carry out the project properly and in a way honourable to the Lord.

It concluded that a number of channels should be looked into before any action taken. One need became overwhelmingly clear – and this is where we can all help; the need to find a person or organisation with experience of working in this type of culture on this sort of project. PLEASE PRAY that if it is the Lord's will, He will show us such an organisation or man/woman.

It is planned to reconvene in one month. If you would like more information, please speak to Robert Read, Mission Committee Chairman.
